# SSFM International launches full-tuition scholarship for UOG engineering students

Civil engineering majors at the University of Guam have an opportunity to apply for a new scholarship from engineering and construction management firm SSFM International. The firm's \$31,300 donation will fund the full cost of tuition and fees for one eligible student per academic year. The company will also include a paid internship opportunity for an eligible student during his or her senior year.
