Grade M, Step 1, \$19.60 - Step 10, \$26.90 per hour

Temporary, Full-Time, 40 hours per week.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree in Biology, Environmental Science or related field OR Master's Degree in related field.
- At least one (1) year of experience working on listed species surveys, research or management preferably with native plants and invertebrates in the CNMI/Guam or other Pacific Islands and possess the appropriate pesticide applicator certifications.

• Three (3) years of professional level work experience with knowledge in rare plant surveys and horticultural skills in the nursery and field.

Minimum Knowledge, Abilities and Skills:

- Ability to identify native plant species of Guam and the Northern Mariana Islands and demonstrate horticultural knowledge.
- Ability to hike through field and difficult terrain in all weather conditions with field gear that weighs up to 50 pounds.
- Ability to communicate effectively with good verbal and written skills.
- Ability to demonstrate skills in summarizing findings and recommendations, as well as proficiency in oral and written presentations.
- Ability to manage time efficiently and ability to prioritize work.
- Ability to work flexible hours, including weekends and evenings, as needed.
- Ability to project budget requirements for future program needs.

Character of Duties:

- Conduct plant field surveys.
- Coordinates and oversees conservation and research programs, as well as the implementation
 of management actions in an efficient and effective manner. Work must be done in accordance
 with applicable Federal, and State regulations and laws, especially regarding endangered
 species, safety and health, and pesticides.
- Leads efforts in the collection of ecological, forest, rare plant, habitat data and plant propagules following established methods.
- Manages staff by orienting and training employees.
- Conduct scientific review of literature.
- Assist in the preparation of field activities.
- Coordinate logistics with the Cooperative Agreement Technical Representative (CATR).
- Manage field equipment and project files.
- Assist in the preparation of materials for project meetings.
- Assist in the preparation of monthly and final reports.
- Actively participates in safety program, assisting in identifying hazards and mitigate actions.
- Must participate in training activities to comply with policies in regard to field collection protocols, safety, diversity and civil rights.
- Other duties relative to project deliverables.
