Full-Time: Social Security, Medical and Dental Insurance, 4 hours annual leave and 4 hours sick leave per pay period, holiday pay, up to 3% 403(b) match based upon employee contribution of 3%.

The position will begin on **February 28, 2022** and end on **February 27, 2023,** based on availability of funds with possibility of extension should additional funds become available.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Master's degree in relevant field from a U.S. regionally accredited institution or foreign equivalent;
- Five (5) years of professional work experience relevant to the position;

Character of Duties:

- Under the USDA Principal Investigator, the Project Director will lead a small team conducting applied research to reduce the negative impacts of invasive Brown Treesnakes on Guam and prevent their spread to other islands. Following the recent discovery of a new Brown Treesnake invasion of Cocos Island, a small islet off the southern coast of Guam, the Project Director will assist the USDA Principal Investigator in planning and implementation of a multi-agency effort to eradicate Brown Treesnakes from Cocos in protection of federally and locally threatened and endangered species. The Project Director may be assigned as a lead investigator or co-investigator for research studies, be required to manage work assignments and ensure the quality of work of other research personnel, perform data analyses, and prepare manuscripts for publication in peer-reviewed science journals. The Project Director will manage personnel matters for other RCUOG personnel assigned to USDA and procurement matters associated with the performance of their duties.
- Duties will include field work in any terrestrial habitat type in Guam and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI). The Project Director should be able to hike moderate distances and work long hours under harsh tropical forest conditions and on rugged terrain. The general work schedule will be normal working hours Monday to Friday, though some study phases will require pre-scheduled work on evenings, weekends, and holidays; flexibility is a must. Temporary travel assignments within the CNMI may be required. The Project Director must have a valid driver's license and be able to pass a background check and obtain access to U.S. military base facilities. The duty station will be the USDA Wildlife Services Guam State Office in Barrigada, Guam. During the COVID pandemic response, telework from the employee's place of residence is required to the maximum extent possible. IT resources are currently not available so the employee must furnish their own computer. The Project Director will perform other duties as assigned.

Police and Court Clearance:

Pursuant to Public Law No. 28-24 and Executive Order No. 2005-34, applicants selected for a position are required to provide original police and court (Superior Court of Guam) clearances of no more than three (3) months old prior to commencement of employment. Off-island applicants must obtain clearances from their place of residence. Applicants are responsible for fees associated with obtaining the clearances

Selected candidate must provide official transcripts prior to hire date.

- for employment. All factors which are job related may be investigated (i.e., previous employment, educational credentials, and criminal records).
- All information obtained may be used to determine the applicant's eligibility for employment in accordance with equal employment opportunity guidelines. In addition, the applicant releases previous employers and job-related sources from legal liability for the information provided.
- Should an applicant be convicted of any crimes other than a minor traffic violation, all applicable information must be provided in the form of a police clearance report and court clearance report. Failure to admit any felony convictions may result in immediate disqualification or disciplinary action.
- Section 25103, Chapter 25, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated requires college or university employees to undergo a physical examination, to include a test for tuberculosis (skin or x-ray), prior to employment and at least annually thereafter. A report of such examination must be conducted by a licensed physician within a state or territory of the United States and must be submitted upon request.
- Federal law requires presentation of eligibility to work in the United States within seventy-two (72) hours of reporting for employment. Specifically, 8 USC 1324A requires the employer to verify the identity and eligibility to work in the United States of all newly hired employees. The Research Corporation of the University of Guam is required to comply with this law on a non-discriminatory basis. If you are hired to fill a position with the Research Corporation of the University of Guam, you will be required to present valid documents to comply with this law.
