Grade M, Step 1, \$19.60 per hour Temporary, Full-Time, 40 hours per week.

Minimum Qualifications:

 Master's degree in relevant field from a U.S. regionally accredited institution or foreign equivalent; OR

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Bachelor's degree in relevant field from a U.S. regionally accredited institution or foreign equivalent and technical training and/or substantial professional level work experience relevant to the position;

Minimum Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:

- Willing and eager to study advanced subjects, master new skills, and contribute to research and exploratory scientific and technical work;
- Excellent communication skills: listening, speaking, and writing in at least English language;
- Proficient with Microsoft Suite programs and knowledgeable in statistical analysis;

Character of Duties:

- Assist the WERI faculty and the WERI laboratory manager;
- Prepare water sampling plans and reports related to the project entitled "Water Quality Monitoring of Agana Swamp on Guam";
- Assist, perform, and/or lead various water quality laboratory testing, including wet chemistry, inorganics, and microbiological analyses;
- Perform various laboratory support duties and tasks related to good laboratory practices, e.g.,glassware cleaning, chemical inventory, reagent preparation, report drafting, etc.;
- Familiarization and/or prior participation in laboratory quality control practices and procedures in a research setting, and/or familiarization with local and federal regulatory monitoring and compliance programs and requirements;
- Familiarization with field sampling of various water matrices (e.g., marine, drinking water, etc.);
- Conduct statistical analyses for water quality data;
- Perform other duties assigned;

Police and Court Clearance:

Pursuant to Public Law No. 28-24 and Executive Order No. 2005-34, applicants selected for a position are required to provide original police and court (Superior Court of Guam) clearances of no more than three (3) months old prior to commencement of employment. Off-island applicants must obtain clearances from their place of residence. Applicants are responsible for fees associated with obtaining the clearances.

Work Eligibility:

- Submission of completed job applications authorizes the Research Corporation of the University of Guam to seek and obtain information regarding the applicant's suitability for employment. All factors which are job related may be investigated (i.e., previous employment, educational credentials, and criminal records).
- The selected candidate must provide proof of education credential claimed (High School diploma, College Transcript) on the application.
- All information obtained may be used to determine the applicant's eligibility for employment in accordance with equal employment opportunity guidelines. In addition, the applicant releases previous employers and job-related sources from legal liability for the information provided.
