Grade J, Step 1, \$14.94 to Step 10, \$20.51 per hour Temporary, Full-Time, 40 hours per week.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree in Biology, Ecology, Natural Resources, Animal Science, or related field from a U.S. regionally accredited institution or foreign equivalent;
- One (1) year of work experience <u>OR</u> combination of college credits, technical training and/or substantial professional level work experience;

Minimum Knowledge, Abilities, and Skills:

- Enthusiasm for science, nature, and the outdoors;
- Experience with field data collection, data entry and proofing, and data summarization;
- Experience with standard wildlife research techniques such as radio telemetry, infrared cameras, trapping, visual surveys, etc.;
- Experience with capture and handling of small animals, particularly snakes and rodents;
- General knowledge of the geography and habitats of Guam;
- Familiarity with general statistical methods and computer programs for statistical analysis (preferably R);
- Good writing skills and the ability to prepare drafts of technical reports;
- Experience coordinating field activities for scientific inquiry, to include occasional assignment of tasks and oversight of work quality of junior personnel;

Character of Duties:

- The Research Associate will support a small team conducting applied research to reduce the negative impacts of invasive Brown Treesnakes on Guam and prevent their spread to other islands.
- Duties will include a high proportion of field work in any terrestrial habitat type on Guam and Cocos Island. The Research Associate should be able to hike moderate distances and work long hours under harsh tropical forest conditions and on rugged terrain.
- The Research Associate may be assigned a role as coordinator for a particular study and may be required to manage work assignments and ensure the quality of work of other research personnel.
- The general work schedule will be normal working hours Monday to Friday, though some study phases will require pre-scheduled work on evenings and weekends; flexibility is a must.
- The Research Associate must have a valid driver's license and be able to pass a background check and obtain access to U.S. military base facilities.
- Other duties assigned.

Police and Court Clearance:

Pursuant to Public Law No. 28-24 and Executive Order No. 2005-34, applicants selected for a position are required to provide original police and court (Superior Court of Guam) clearances of no more than three (3) months old prior to commencement of employment. Off-island applicants must obtain clearances from their place of residence. Applicants are responsible for fees associated with obtaining the clearances.

Work Eligibility:

- Submission of completed job applications authorizes the Research Corporation of the University of Guam to seek and obtain information regarding the applicant's suitability for employment. All factors which are job related may be investigated (i.e., previous employment, educational credentials, and criminal records).
- The selected candidate must provide proof of education credential claimed (High School diploma, College Transcript) on the application.
- All information obtained may be used to determine the applicant's eligibility for employment in accordance with equal employment opportunity guidelines. In addition, the applicant releases previous employers and job-related sources from legal liability for the information provided.
- Should an applicant be convicted of any crimes other than a minor traffic violation, all applicable information must be provided in the form of a police clearance report and court clearance report. Failure to admit any felony convictions may result in immediate disqualification or disciplinary action.
- Applicants accepting employment or volunteer work with educational institutions and/or agencies requiring a health clearance must take and pass a pre-entry and annual Tuberculosis Test as a condition of employment.
- Federal law requires presentation of eligibility to work in the United States within seventy-two (72) hours of reporting for employment. Specifically, 8 USC 1324A requires the employer to verify the identity and eligibility to work in the United States of all newly hired employees. The Research Corporation of the University of Guam is required to comply with this law on a non-discriminatory basis. If you are hired to fill a position with the Research Corporation of the University of Guam, you will be required to present valid documents to comply with this law.

The Research Corporation of the University of Guam complies with Public Law 24-109 in reference to the provisions and requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act.
