


## INVITATION TO ATTEND & PRESENT

This year's theme What We WEAVE through the Language Arts is an opportunity for present and future Educators, scholars, and researchers of the Language Arts to examine What it is that We Weave and are able to Weave in our home, school, and public lives because of the Language Arts. And as is the mission of this conference, we must reflect on the value of What We WEAVE through the Language Arts for our students, for ourselves, for our families, for our local, regional, and global communities.

The conference organizers solicit proposals for conference presentations, workshops, and poster sessions on Language Arts topics and classroom activities that consider the following:

- What pathways for success are we helping our students Weave through the Language Arts curriculum?
- Do the assignments we give provide opportunities for our students to achieve success not only in the language arts, but also in their other classes?
- How do we frame Language Arts education for our students to prepare them for success as well as future challenges?
- What Language Arts challenges must our students overcome in order to achieve success?
- Are our students, often a diverse student population, confronting the challenges, disappointments, confusion, inherent with any attempt to weave home, school and public lives into a singular experience?

- Why is weaving home, school, and public lives into a singular experience often perceived as the only means in which to increase their odds of success in school and for the rest of their lives? What are we doing to get in their way?
- How are we contributing to the problem and why are we not aiding their attempt at success in school and life? What can we do to weave our students and their learning together so that what we are weaving is success?
- Are we celebrating what are students Weave by showcasing their work in public spaces? How are we doing it?
- How can we weave / integrate other content areas into our language arts lessons?

We especially invite presentations and poster sessions that exemplify our students' successes in the Language Arts - of course with appropriate parental permission given for public displays or presentations.

Individual and group presentations will be scheduled for 45-minutes during the break-out sessions on Friday evening, Saturday morning, or Saturday afternoon. Presenters may propose extended and two-day session formats, especially for workshops.
