#### COURSE CATALOG DESCRIPTION

This is a continuation of CI101. Emphasis is on improving and adding to oral-aural competency gained in CI101. Reading in the Chinese language is also stressed, and more complex language structures and concepts are taught.

#### **COURSE CONTENT**

This course continues the study of basic Chinese grammar and vocabulary begun in CI101, with additional student practices on the five tones of the standard Chinese, and the systems of writing Chinese language, including the pinyin system of phonetic notation and both traditional and simplified Chinese characters. There are oral practices with a partner(s) and the teacher, quizzes, and daily assignments.

## COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

1) Mandatory Attendance: you are required to attend the following activities:

- practice with your partner(s) everyday kaccording to the course schedule.
- oral activity with the teacher during the class
- assignments (see the schedule)

2) Class Attendance Policies: to pass this course (to avoid getting an F in this course), do not:

#### 1) How to Learn the Course Contents

#### 3) Oral Assignments

You will have either an <u>Oral Assignment</u> or a <u>Quiz</u> every day (M-Th). It is indicated as 'Oral' or 'Quiz' on the schedule. For Oral Assignment, you record your practice using recording devices. Do not miss Oral Assignments more than **10 times**, or you will get an **F** in this course.

#### 4) Quizzes

Do not miss more than **3 quizzes**, or you will get an **F** in this course. The quizzes may included reading, writing, listening or speaking.

#### 5) Oral Practice with Your Partner

You will be assigned a conversation partner(s). Information about your partner will be announced later. You will practice tasks with your partner from Taiwan. The online conversation practice with your partner is **mandatory**. If you miss it more than 3 times without a reasonable reason, you will get an F in this course.

First, send your partner an email and discuss what time you and your partner(s) want to practice. You can do it any time during the practice day. Remember that you need to <u>watch the topic or questions first</u>, before you practice with your partner. Then, contact her/him using **Zoom on the oral activity page** (click the Zoom icon on the right-hand side).

Practice time should last at least **20** *minutes*. You need to practice until both you and your partner feel comfortable to say the sentences.

#### Note:

• If your partner does not respond to your emails or calls, please contact the teacher immediately. If you do not do anything, you will be considered as having missed this practice.

#### 6) Oral Activity with the Teacher

You need to contact Ms.Lin on the specified dates. You can meet in HSS#101. . Each person practices for 10-15 minutes. This activity is mandatory. If you miss the activity more than three times without a reasonable reason, you will get an **F** in this course.
